**Financial Report** – Director of Finance Chris Benson presented the 2024 Financials. It was acknowledged that the books are not in as good a shape as they were in the previous financial year. This is due to high-pressure cost inflation during the year. The club was not as successful as we have been in the past at applying for and gaining grant funding. This has been addressed, as the club is now working with Sportslink. NOBM must continue looking for fresh revenue streams through sponsorship and other initiatives.

Bill Reilly asked whether the club had done an insurance valuation this year. CB replied that we had not; however, this is done every two years. Inflation is built into the existing insurance costs each year, so spending the money to have this done annually is not economical. Bill Riley questioned why the lawnmower is listed on the club asset register as it is not a club asset. This was removed from the list of club assets.

#### **General Business:**

- 1. Player Development: The Premier squad is similar to 2024, with several players returning and talent in key positions coming from outside the region. The Colts will have a full squad to pick from, with several school leavers joining the squad. The coaches for the Premiers / Thirds / Colts have been appointed. Work is still ongoing to fill the coaches and manage the Premier Reserves.
- 2. Auditing: A motion to amend the club constitution regarding annual audit requirements was presented. It is no longer a legal requirement for clubs to have their accounts audited annually and there is a shortage of auditors who can do this. NOBM will remove this wording from the constitution and change it to 'Chartered Accountants will prepare the clubs' financial statements.' (Passed and all agreed.)
- **3.** New Board Structure Alex Nixon presented this. The restructure will formalise and streamline specific roles within the club to allow more people to help in needed areas. Examples include a sponsorship committee, someone to run the 200-club raffle, and a designated ground controller. Feedback on this restructure will occur, and the structure will be put into practice in 2025.
- **4. Life Membership** Gary Macdonald addressed the meeting and explained the process of life member nominations and process taken. Robbie Morrison was given life membership. He was nominated by Gary MacDonald and presented with the life membership badge by Patron Ian MacRae.

Mike O'Connor was given life membership. Terry Gittings nominated him, and Patron Ian MacRae presented him with the badge.

There being no further business the *Annual Meeting closed at 7.00pm*.

# PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is again my privilege to present my Presidents report for the 2025 rugby year. The club continues to be one of the strongest in Hawkes Bay, both on and off the field, which is a credit to all our members, particularly those involved in the day to day running of our club.

In 2025 we fielded four senior teams with mixed results which will be expanded on in our rugby reports, but once again our Premier team performed to an extremely high standard being first equal in the Nash Cup round and reaching the semi-finals of the Maddison trophy. Thanks to coaches Ellery Wilson and Matt Wyatt and their management team for ensuring we remain a top competitive side. Our young Colts team continued to develop with a big step up in results from previous years thanks to the work put in by coaches Sam Birch, Steve Smithers and Jason Evans. Our Senior Thirds as in past seasons continue to represent our club with a mix of experienced and new players and remain an extremely important part of our club with more wins every year. Sadly, our Senior Seconds struggled this year after many years of dominance, this largely due to the lack of coaching personnel. Huge thanks to Frank Ene, (our 2025 best club member) for his tireless efforts to keep this team going and also his involvement in our junior rugby coaching.

Congratulations to all our prize winners in 2025 especially to Kere Penitito our "KR Tremain Sportsman of the Year". And to those players who were selected for further HBRFU representative teams after the club season had finished.

Off the field, as per the Club Management Report, our facilities and social side of the club continue to result in a very pleasurable place to be on a Saturday afternoon. A lot more corporate and private functions throughout the off-season continues to result in a very solid bar turnover and profit. Also thanks also to Matt Wyatt who is progressing through some storage and changing room alterations and enhancements to ensure we can cater for all sports and their needs going forward.

Our financial report shows that we continue to be financially very sound with a solid balance sheet. Funding options continue to be a challenge with more initiatives being discussed to increase overall revenue.

Junior rugby numbers in general are down which has also reflected in our club too but thanks to the hard-working committee, led by Glenn Fulcher, Bevan Condin and Ben Guild we continue to field competitive teams in all grades. Our Kindy ripper program had large numbers this year so that is encouraging for going forward. During the 2025 season I had the privilege of touring with our U13 team to Palmerston North and Christchurch earlier this year and was very proud of the way they represented Napier Old Boys Marist. We look forward to all those young players returning to our club in the future as colts or premier players. Thanks also to all other junior coaches and committee members.

Thanks to all the volunteers who make the club what it is. We always need coaches, managers, and people to do the many little jobs during the year. A special thank you also to our bar staff and kitchen team for their efforts in 2025. And of course a very special vote of Thanks to our very essential and generous sponsors. We hope you get value from your sponsorship of Napier Old Boys Marist and we will continue to promote your brand as much as possible.

# **FINANCE REPORT**

#### FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE

The 2025 financial statements show a net loss after depreciation of \$17,553. This is an improvement on last year's \$66,725 loss.

The major changes in income and expenses are as follows:

Positive

Increase in bar trading activities \$17,000

Increase in Grant income \$30,000

Negative

Increase in Rugby Hospitality \$11,000

Increase in Insurance and Electricity \$4,000

Increase in Spillane tournament expenses \$9,000

**Bar Profit** 

Bar sales were up \$8,000 compared with last year. Both Cost of Sales and Bar Expenses were reduced, which resulted in Bar Trading profit doubling to \$34,000. The bar is well supported during the season and bookings outside of the rugby calendar continue to grow. Thanks to management and staff for all their hard work

**Grant Funding** 

Grant funding was up significantly this year. Working closely with Sportslink we were able to receive funds from Pub Charity, Grassroots and Lion Foundation. This remains a difficult income stream to predict going forward so we are continuing to look for additional revenue options.

Rugby Hospitality

More playoff teams, larger Gold Card/Sponsors day and vouchers were contributing factors to hospitality cost increases.

Insurance and Electricity

Increases in insurance and electricity costs continue to reflect the inflationary pressures the club is facing. A building valuation was undertaken this year to ensure our coverage is adequate. We have recently installed solar panels which will reduce our energy costs for the coming year.

Spillane Tournament

Expenses for Spillane tournament in Hamilton this year were over \$9,000 when accounting for 2 nights of accommodation, travel and some meals. We attempted multiple funding applications to cover these costs, but none were successful. These costs will be much lower with the tournament in Hastings for 2026.

Financial Position

The club has Net Assets of \$464,000 and no borrowings.

Cash and Bank is up \$22,000 from last year, most of which is team funds held by the junior club.

The only capital asset purchased during the year was a marquee.

# **RUGBY REPORT**

It is our pleasure to present the Rugby Director's Report for the 2025 season. As highlighted in the President's Report, the club continues to stand strong both on and off the field, and this year's rugby programme reflected that same level of commitment, resilience and pride across all grades.

We fielded five senior teams this season, each experiencing their own challenges and successes, but all contributing strongly to our club culture and identity. Our Premier side once again performed at a high standard, finishing second in the Nash Cup with only one loss, and placing fourth in the Maddison Trophy before falling to Taradale in the semi-finals. Injuries throughout the Maddison round tested our depth significantly, but the team showed admirable character in continuing to compete strongly each week. Our thanks go to Premier coaches Ellery Wilson and Matt Wyatt, and managers Mitch Gardiner, Anthony Easson and Peter "Bam Bam" Bainbridge.

Our Colts again proved competitive, finishing third in both rounds before bowing out in the semi-final to Taradale. A season full of promise, the team will return with strong numbers in 2026, bolstered by our excellent recruitment pathway from St John's College and a large returning playing group. Thank you to coaches Sam Birch and Steve Smithers, and manager Jason Evans for their ongoing investment in our young talent.

The Senior Seconds experienced a mixed season, placing third in the first round before finishing last in the second despite identical win/loss records. This grade faced challenges with player numbers later in the season, something we must address for 2026. A number of Colts will step up next year, and a commitment to strengthening this grade is essential. Thank you to coaches Frank Ene and Sami Lauano who worked tirelessly under difficult circumstances.

Our Senior Thirds showed the biggest improvement of all grades. After finishing last in the first round, the side rallied superbly to finish fourth in the second round with three wins. The return of several older club men helped strengthen the group, and the team's contribution off the field was outstanding, cleaning the changing rooms every Sunday and coordinating work parties throughout the season. Thank you to coaches Tom Grant and Mike Boyd, with assistance from Adam de Lautour.

The U85s unfortunately struggled with numbers and were unable to complete the season. This grade remains a challenge not only for NOBM but for clubs locally, particularly with clashes during the representative calendar. Early commitment from players will be crucial if this grade is to return in 2026.

Across our coaching and management group, I am pleased to report stability heading into 2026, with all senior coaches returning and several new managers joining our structure. A number of our coaches and players also contributed to Hawke's Bay representative teams, reflecting well on both their capability and the club's standing.

These players represented our club with pride, and we congratulate them all on their success.

Player numbers overall were solid with 83 registered senior players, although like many clubs nationally, retention and recruitment will remain ongoing challenges. We expect strong Premier retention again next season, have promising conversations underway with several out-of-region players, and continue to deepen our relationship with St John's College. Strengthening our connection with Napier Boys' High School will be a key focus moving forward.

Preseason planning is well advanced with Premiers beginning in early January and all remaining grades mid-to-late January with Dwayne Smith overseeing fitness and conditioning across the club. We will also field both Premier and Colts teams in the Spillane Tournament, which will be hosted in Hastings this year.

Junior rugby numbers were down this season, with 113 registered players across 10 teams. This reflects a nationwide trend, not just a club issue. The junior committee, together with the Board, is exploring new ways to grow numbers and reconnect young families with rugby. Our Kindy Ripper programme remained a highlight, thanks to the enthusiasm and leadership of Ricardo Fox, and retaining these players into the junior grades will be an important focus next year.

Across the club, player numbers and coaching depth remain ongoing challenges, exacerbated by declining national participation and earlier retirements among players. Encouraging ex-players to return as coaches, managers or volunteers will be essential to maintaining strong rugby structures.

Finally, I would like to thank all players, coaches, managers, physios, volunteers and supporters for their efforts this season. To those who assisted with field setup, ground control, or cleaning changing rooms—your contributions, though often unseen, are greatly appreciated. As we move into 2026, we will be seeking additional volunteers to help lighten this load.

Despite the challenges facing our sport, 2025 was a year that demonstrated resilience, pride and continued progress for NOBM rugby. With a stable coaching team, exciting young talent, strong recruitment pathways and committed volunteers, we are well positioned for another successful season ahead.

We have also developed some ongoing, mutually beneficial support from solar and energy providers, to look at innovative ways to move towards more efficient and clean energies, which is evidenced by the new solar panels on our roof. We have seen another successful year for events and clubroom bookings, again hosting numerous events from the NOBM Invitational Sevens Tournament, numerous meetings, educational events, community fundraising events and. We have again had our facilities utilised by other sporting, community and Business groups: Intercity Junior Rugby, the hosting of the vast majority of Hawkes Bay Rugby age grade, and feeder teams, home games and visitors, Hawkes Bay Magpies, Hawkes Bat Sevens, Poverty Bay RFU, Central Football, NZ Police, NZ Corrections Services, Napier City Council, Hawkes Bay Regional Council, EIT, Pan Pac, TW Civil and Fulton Hogan events.

#### **Season Overview**

# **Our Challenge: Player Numbers**

Right, the elephant in the room. Player numbers across Hawke's Bay have been dropping over the past four years, and we've felt it hard. We had 147 registered junior players this year (plus 30ish Kindy Rippas) inside the new Xplorer system, which is... let's call it "a user experience". But here's the bright spot: Kindy Rippa – A Huge Win For the last few years, our Kindy numbers have been tiny — like "could fit everyone in a minivan" tiny. So this year we went all in: • Free registration • Paid social ads • U12 leadership team running sessions • Active recruitment • High-energy Friday chaos

Result: 64 registered kindy players. ,And on average around 25 turned up weekly (with the usual sickness, birthdays, sleep-ins, and tantrums factored in). This is massive, and we're confident this will boost our U6 intake for 2026.

We fielded 10 teams plus Kindy, across: • Kindy Rippa, U6, U7, U8 x2, U9 x2, U10, U11, U12 and U13 That's a lot of boots to tie, jerseys to wash, and oranges to slice — and we're proud of every team that wore our colours.

# **Club Culture & Highlights**

Overall, it was another hugely positive year. Our kids represented NOBM with pride, good humour, and strong sportsmanship. We had very few issues throughout the season — a minor miracle in itself. We tried a preseason all in training and received good numbers and feedback. This enabled plyers to start drifting in, parents to mingle and coaches freed up to talk with families. Our Club Day was a train wreck due to Hawke's Bay Rugby Unions ability to forget scheduled requests – however we made the final day of rugby a big shin dig with the usual activities, food and the seniors rocking out the BBQ. The committee has genuinely loved being part of the journey and watching our teams develop. The kids keep us coming back. (Well... the kids and the post-game beverages.)

- U11 to U12 transition current numbers are too thin for a full 15-a-side season Recruitment, visibility in schools, and more early-age engagement will be key.
